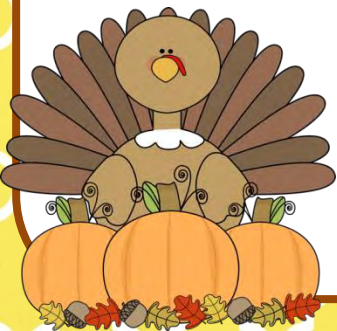

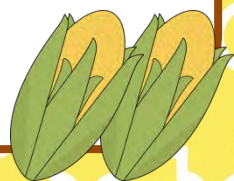

Prescription Drug Survey Results

Grady County community members recently participated in a Prescription Drug Survey via Survey Monkey for an assessment for the SPF PFS program. Below are some of the highlighted results.

Total respondents: 47

95.74% of respondents believe the non-medical use of prescription drugs is a problem in Grady County.

74.47% of respondents says the easiest place to get prescription drugs is from a family member and **68%** says a friend.

66% of respondents say common location in Grady County that people have used prescription drugs for non-medical reasons is at home.

51% of respondents feel like the doctors, pharmacists, and health care professionals in Grady County do not warn people on the dangers of the non-medical use of prescription drugs.

77% of respondents believe people in Grady County do not think they risk harming themselves by using prescriptions not prescribed to them?

72% of respondents believe that doctors are the main prescribing source in Grady County.

Grady County has seen a rise in fatal overdoses related to prescription drugs, **98%** of respondents believe this is caused by either the misuse or the abuse of prescription drugs.

51% of respondents are not aware of what the prescription drug laws are in Grady County.

In the past 90 DAYS, **62%** of respondents have not read, seen or heard any advertising messages discussing the importance of properly disposing leftover or unused prescription medications.
