Upcoming RBSS Training in Grady County!

The Red Rock Regional Prevention Coordinator (RPC) along with the ABLE Commission will host a Responsible Beverage Service and Sales (RBSS) Training to Grady County on June 22nd, 2017 at the Canadian Valley Vo-Tech in Chickasha. There will be two sessions offered: 9 am and 1 pm.

The goal of RBSS is to train store clerks, servers, bartenders, and management of establishments that serve alcohol the basic knowledge and skills to practice responsible alcohol sales and services. RBSS is a developed program through the ABLE Commission and the Oklahoma State Department of Mental Health.
