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National Drug Facts Week

Red Rock Regional Prevention Coordinator (RPC) would like you to know that National Drug Facts Week (NDFW) is January 26th, 2015 through February 1st, 2015. National Drug Facts Week was launched in 2010 by the National Institute on Drug Abuse (NIDA), which is part of the National Institute of Health. It is an annual health observance week for teens to shatter the myths about drugs and drug abuse. Communities, schools, and organizations are joining forces with NIDA to encourage teens to get the facts through community-based events and activities that focus on the science behind drug abuse.

On January 30th, 2015, Drug Facts Chat Day will be during National Drug Facts Week. It is an annual live online chat held between high school students and NIDA scientists. Students from around the country ask the expert scientists questions they most want the answers to about drugs and drug abuse, including drug effects, how to help friends or family that are abusing drugs, and what causes addiction.
